Review requested: adequacy of search and failure to dispose separately of five record categories

Public Access Counselor:

I submit this signed Request for Review under 5 ILCS 140/9.5 concerning the Office of Emergency Management and Communications' July 29, 2026 final response to FOIA F267482-071726. OEMC received the noncommercial request on July 17, 2026. This Request for Review is timely.

The attached consolidated record contains the complete operative FOIA request, OEMC's response, and the spreadsheet supplied with that response.

WHY REVIEW IS REQUESTED

The FOIA request contained five separately defined categories: (1) CAD and event records; (2) associated 911 and 311 records; (3) radio, dispatch, telephone, console, and operational audio and metadata; (4) responding-agency and interagency-identification records; and (5) existing retention, preservation, audit, and system records.

OEMC's determination states only that it conducted a search, that the search generated no matching records, and that "there were no calls found for the date and location provided." It does not separately dispose of the five categories or identify any exemption.

The supplied spreadsheet is a one-page "Police MIS.Oecec602 Report" showing a Standard Location Search Report Summary. The visible parameters are June 1 through June 30, 2026, time "ALL," Service Location "%8516 W WINONA%," Address of Occurrence "%8516 W WINONA%," and Total "0." On its face, that report documents one address-form query. It does not establish searches by premise identifier, geocode, linked event, unit activity, person, warrant number, case number, outside-agency-assist notation, telephone request, radio event, or other source specifically identified in the request.

Category 5 also requested existing generally applicable retention schedules, system-retention periods, deletion or overwrite intervals, preservation status, audit entries, and custodian information. Those records are not dependent on whether an address-based call was located. OEMC's response does not explain whether those existing records were searched, withheld, or overlooked.

REQUESTED RELIEF

I respectfully request that the PAC obtain from OEMC the records necessary to evaluate the search, including the systems and custodians searched, the instructions and parameters used, the search dates, and the report-generation information for the spreadsheet supplied.



I ask the PAC to determine whether OEMC conducted a search reasonably calculated to locate records responsive to each category; whether its blanket no-record response adequately disposed of Category 5; and whether OEMC must conduct a supplemental search and issue a category-specific response that produces reasonably segregable nonexempt records or identifies the statutory basis for any withholding.

Exhibit A is the complete thirteen-page consolidated record for F267482-071726, including the request, the July 29 response, the spreadsheet, and the embedded-record manifest. The signed Request for Review is the present instrument.

The 911 and Dispatch Records Decide Who Came to My Door on June 6. Produce Them, and Preserve Them.

RE**OEMC computer-aided-dispatch, 911, and radio records for the June 6, 2026 law-enforcement activity at 8516 W. Winona St., Chicago**

A statutory request under 5 ILCS 140 — five categories — and a preservation demand for the CAD and audio that identify the responding units.

To the OEMC FOIA Officer:

This is a request under the Illinois Freedom of Information Act, 5 ILCS 140, and a preservation demand. OEMC holds the records that answer a question no one else can answer cleanly: which units were dispatched to, or self-initiated activity at, my residence at 8516 W. Winona Street on June 6, 2026, at approximately 1:03 p.m. and 5:51 p.m. I have limited this request to five categories, one date, one address, and two identified time windows to avoid the category-count prong of the voluminous-request definition and minimize any search burden.

THE FIVE CATEGORIES (DATE: JUNE 6, 2026, AT AND NEAR 8516 W. WINONA ST.)

- 1 The computer-aided-dispatch (CAD) event records for any law-enforcement dispatch or self-initiated on-scene activity at or near 8516 W. Winona St. on June 6, 2026 — including event numbers, create and clear times (including the entries near 1:03 p.m. and 5:51 p.m.), call type, creating source, the responding unit and agency, and disposition.
- 2 The 911 and 311 call records and the ANI/ALI (caller-identification and location) data associated with those events.
- 3 The radio-run and audio recordings for the units that responded to or handled those events.
- 4 Any record identifying whether the responding units were CPD units or an outside agency (Lincolnshire Police or Lake County) operating through, or coordinating with, OEMC dispatch — including any assist-outside-agency or interagency entry.
- 5 The retention and preservation status of each of the above categories, and the applicable retention schedule.

PRESERVATION — BECAUSE CAD AND AUDIO EXPIRE ON SHORT CYCLES

Independent of production, preserve every record within the five categories in native form with all metadata, timestamps, and audio intact, and suspend any deletion, overwrite, or retention-based purge that would reach the June 6 windows. These records are evidence in a pending federal civil rights action, Allababidi v. Shepherd, N.D. Ill. No. 1:26-cv-06738, and their loss after receipt of this letter will be documented under Fed. R. Civ. P. 37(e).

HANDLING

- 1 **Clock.** The 5-business-day period of 5 ILCS 140/3(d) runs from your receipt; any extension under 3(e) requires written notice stating the statutory reason.

- 2 **Format and fees.** Produce electronic records in native format with metadata, 5 ILCS 140/6(a). A fee waiver is requested under 6(c); the records concern law-enforcement conduct at a private residence under an active constitutional challenge and the request is non-commercial.
- 3 **Denials.** Any withholding must comply with 5 ILCS 140/9, citing the specific exemption and releasing segregable non-exempt material; exempt system-field data should be redacted rather than the CAD or audio record withheld whole.

ACKNOWLEDGE ON RECEIPT; PRESERVE IMMEDIATELY

Return the OEMC tracking number and statutory due date on receipt, and confirm the preservation of the June 6 CAD, 911, and audio records now — before any retention cycle can reach them. I retain proof of transmission and will calendar the statutory date from the delivery record.

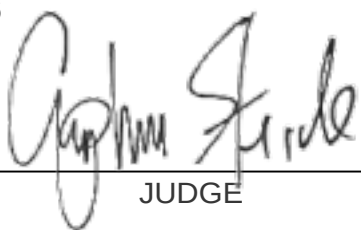

Ladies and Gentlemen:

I. NATURE AND URGENCY OF THIS NOTICE

This Notice is served upon each of you in your individual and official capacities to provide actual, written notice of the following jurisdictional and constitutional facts, each of which carries immediate consequences for any law enforcement officer or command staff member who takes any affirmative action to enforce the warrant described herein.

(2) **Cease All Active Execution Attempts.** Immediately suspend all physical, surveillance-based, or intelligence-driven efforts to locate and apprehend the subject individual at the Winona Street residence or elsewhere. Any further attempt to execute this warrant after receipt of this Notice will be deemed an intentional, knowing violation of clearly established constitutional law and will result in the immediate filing of a supplemental complaint naming the executing officers and their supervisors as individual defendants.

(3) **Initiate an Internal Inquiry.** Commence an immediate internal inquiry into the circumstances under which officers of your command conducted physical presence operations at the subject residence, including the factual basis for any surveillance, the chain of command authorizing such operations, and whether any officer or dispatcher had actual or constructive knowledge of the pending federal civil rights action before such operations commenced.

(4) **Duty to Intervene — 7th Circuit Mandate.** Under *Byrd v. Brishke*, 466 F.2d 6 (7th Cir. 1972), and its progeny, every law enforcement officer possesses an affirmative constitutional duty to intervene to prevent another officer from violating a citizen's constitutional rights. Because the Chicago Police Department (16th District) now possesses actual knowledge that the Lake County warrant is a product of *Napue* perjury, any CPD officer who observes or assists Lincolnshire Police or Lake County deputies in executing this warrant at the Winona Street residence — and fails to actively intervene to stop the unlawful seizure — will be held equally liable under 42 U.S.C. § 1983.

(5) **Notify Other Agencies.** Immediately notify all mutual-aid, task force, and regional law enforcement entities operating within your jurisdictional sphere that execution of this warrant has been formally refused and that enforcement has been suspended pending federal judicial review.

V. MANDATORY LITIGATION HOLD AND PRESERVATION OF EVIDENCE

This Notice activates an immediate, mandatory litigation hold under Fed. R. Civ. P. 37(e) and the inherent authority of the federal courts to sanction spoliation of evidence. All routine document retention, rotation, and destruction policies are suspended effective immediately as to the following categories of evidence:

Dispatch Logs and Communications: All dispatch logs, computer-aided dispatch (CAD) records, radio communications transcripts, and internal communications relating to any deployment of officers to the Winona Street residence or to any attempt to execute the warrant described herein.

Doorbell Camera and Residential Surveillance Footage: All front doorbell camera footage, residential surveillance system recordings, and any other video or audio records capturing law enforcement presence at or near 8516 W. Winona St., Chicago, IL on June 6, 2026. This specifically includes footage recorded at approximately 1:03 PM and 5:51 PM, which documents
